Newly Constructed Positive Place Boys & Girls Club Set to Reopen and Serve Hundreds of Youths

GAINESVILLE, GA – February 21, 2025 - With its original goal to tackle facility upgrades and enhance safety measures, the Boys & Girls Clubs of Lanier decided to demolish its previous facility at Positive Place to reconstruct a 25,000-square-foot facility, costing \$8.5 million to serve the students of Hall County. On March 13, 2025, the Positive Place Boys & Girls Club (1 Positive Place) will host its grand reopening at 4:00pm for special guests and local leaders to tour and experience the newly constructed facility.

The previous Positive Place Club served the children of Hall County for more than 50 years, helping to improve the community and its citizens. "With more than 20,500 kids leaving school every day with no safe place to go in the Lanier area, it is our goal to serve more kids, more often, making a greater impact. To do that, we needed a new facility," said Boys & Girls Clubs of Lanier Chief Executive Officer, Steve Mickens. "The modern, functional and an environmentally conscious facility will serve the needs of our community for years to come."

With a growing teen participation, the building includes a dedicated space for middle school teens (ages 11 - 13) to achieve higher graduation rates and a clear plan and vision for their future. The new facility will deliver hands-on engaging educational opportunities that allow students of all ages to explore a variety of career interests – and have fun in the process. The facility will meet the demands of the community's current and future needs.
