Make a Book

Ms. Rosa from the GEA Club shows us how to make a book.


You will need:

- Paper
- Markers, crayons, colored pencils, or pens
- Permanent marker or black marker
- Something to use as game pieces
- Dice (optional)

Instructions

First, decide what kind of book you will be making by creating an outline. An **outline** is a general plan that highlights the essential features. For a book, the essential features are things like the **setting** (where the book takes place), the **characters**, and the **main idea** (the big idea or point behind a story).

You can make an outline by just writing down ideas, or using what's called a **web**. A web looks like the picture to the right. You put the main idea in the middle and supporting ideas in the bubbles around the outside.



Once you have your book mapped out, it's time to start writing! You can also **illustrate**, or draw pictures, to go along with your book.

Make a cover by drawing a picture about the book. Don't forget to add a title and who the book is by!


Sight Word Go Fish

Ms. Stephany from the Walters Club teaches us how to make a "Go Fish" game with our sight words!



You will need:

- Paper or index cards
- Something to write with
- Sight Word list



Instructions

Start by making your cards by cutting your paper into smaller pieces. You can fold the paper to give your guide lines to help you cut.

Next, write your sight words on the cards. You need to write each word twice so you can make matches when you play! You can also decorate your cards , if you'd like!

You're ready to play! Shuffle your cards and deal them out to the players. Each player should have the same amount of cards and you should have a small deck of cards left over.

To play Go Fish, start by making any matches that you can with the cards you were dealt. Set your matches aside. When it's your turn, ask the other players if they have the match to your card. Example: "Hannah, do you have the word 'pig.'"

If that player has the card, they give it to you so you can make a match. If they don't they will say "Go Fish," and you draw a card from the deck.

Play continues until there aren't any cards left. Whoever has the most cards, wins!

Marble Paper

Mrs. Robin from the Walters Club shows us an awesome art project!



You will need:

- Cardstock paper
- Shaving cream
- Food coloring
- A baking sheet or pan
- 2 craft sticks, butter knife, or plastic knife

Instructions

Spray shaving cream in half of the baking dish. Then, drop food coloring all over the shaving cream.

Take one of your craft sticks and swirl the food coloring and shaving cream around. Now, take your cardstock paper, lay it on top of the shaving cream, and press down lightly.

Now, take your other craft stick or your butter knife and scrape the excess shaving cream off of the paper. Set the paper aside to dry. Repeat until you have made all of the marble paper that you want!


Happy 4th of July!

Here are two fun art activities for you to help celebrate the July 4th holiday!

Firework Salt Painting

You will need:

- Salt
- Watercolor paint
- Paper
- Liquid glue
- Paintbrush



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Instructions:

Using your glue, make starburst designs on your paper. Pour salt onto the glue and set it aside so it can dry. Once dry, use your watercolor to paint the salt!

Firework Stamp Craft

You will need:

- Toilet paper or paper towel roll (just the cardboard tube)
- Paint
- Scissors
- Paper



Instructions:

Using your scissors, cut slits around one side of the cardboard tube. Cut a slit all the way through the roll and roll or fold it hotdog style. Fold the slits you cut around one side of the tube out. Dip the cardboard tube into paint and stamp onto your paper!
