## Opening the new **Tim Lee Club**

In June, Boys & Girls Clubs of Lanier opened the Tim Lee Club in Habersham County. Over the summer, the camp served 100 kids with an eight-week, full day program. In the fall, the Club transitioned to an afterschool program while another eight new Club sites opened in the county's elementary schools. Thanks to a strong group of community leaders, we are now serving nearly 200 youth and families in Habersham County.

# Forsyth County **Groundbreaking**

In September, BGCL broke ground on the new Tommy & Chantal Bagwell Club. When our first standalone Club in Forsyth County opens, we will serve 300 youth in grades K-12. The 21,000-foot facility will be equipped with a teaching kitchen, dedicated teen center, and gymnasium. Eventually, the property will be expanded to include sports fields, tennis and basketball courts, and a fitness and wellness path. We look forward to creating more great moments for youth and families at our new world-class facility in Forsyth County!
